3 Safety and Traffic Reminders

Our Student Planner also contains important information on safety for all Eliasians. Please spend some time going through the safety information in the School Planner with your child/ward and reinforce the key points with them.

To ensure orderly dismissal, we appeal to parents/ guardians/ caregivers not to obstruct student movement, and to practise social distancing when waiting outside all the school gates. We would also appreciate if you could train your child/ward to look out for the right person to accompany him/her home and not to follow strangers or their friends. If your child is unable to find his/her caregiver during dismissal, he/she should go the General Office for assistance.

We would like to appeal to all parents/guardians who drive their child/ward to school to use the designated covered drop-off/pick-up points located near Blocks 517 and 504, Pasir Ris Street 52, during peak traffic periods. B SCHOOL PROGRAMMES IN TERM 3

1 Racial Harmony Day Celebrations

Every year, EPPS commemorates Racial Harmony Day (RHD) as a reminder to our students and staff on how we can play a part to build a cohesive society. A series of activities have been planned for our students from Monday 15 July to Friday 19 July 2024 to gain deeper understanding on the importance of harmony and social cohesion. 2 National Day Celebrations

National Day falls on Friday, 9 August, marking our nation's 59th birthday. The theme "Together, As One United People" emphasises the collective strength of Singaporeans and highlights the importance of everyone rallying together to share our future and uplift those around us.

The National Day celebrations in school will take place on Thursday, 8 August from 7.30 a.m. to 10.30 a.m. All Eliasians will report to school as usual and we will begin our morning assembly and observance ceremony at 7.25 a.m. Please note that the dress code is a red/ PE t-shirt, with PE shorts and school shoes. 3 Interdisciplinary Project Work (IPW)

Our IPW programme develops students who will grow to become citizen leaders with empathy and resilience, as they work together to solve the issues, supporting our nuCLEAR@EPPS.

The Primary 4 students will embark on their IPW over a period of one week in their English, Mathematics and Science lessons. Working in groups, students will collaborate to explore issues presented to them. Through these projects, our students will learn the process of Design Thinking and about the impact of littering on the environment and the importance of being self-sufficient. More crucially, students will recognise the part they can play and how their actions can help to protect our environment.

4 Teachers' Day Celebrations

Teachers play an important role in a student's life. As an educator, one seeks to inspire and motivate students to reach their full potential. Apart from guiding them in their academics, teachers can develop students by nurturing their emotional development, fostering their social skills, inculcating good values, and guiding them with ways to resolve modern day challenges.

In EPPS, celebrations will be held during curriculum hours on Thursday, 29 August 2024, where we show appreciation to our teachers and support staff for their dedication and selflessness in guiding

5 Swimsafer Programme (Primary 4)

Swimming is a useful skill which promotes strength, endurance and flexibility. It also increases one's stamina and enhances coordination. Children can swim to stay active, develop life skills as well as build a foundation to a healthy and active lifestyle.

The SwimSafer programme teaches children to be water-safe and acquire life-long swimming skills. The ability to swim is a learning outcome in the Physical Education Primary Syllabus. Our Primary 4 pupils will attend this programme from Term 3 Week 10 to Term 4 Week 6. It will take place every Tuesday morning during curriculum time.
