2 Ensuring a Safe Environment for All

EPPS will continue to employ measures to ensure a safe school and examination environment, including wiping down high-touch surfaces and conducting visual screening of students' well-being. 3 MOE Kindergarten @ Elias Park (MK@Elias Park)

The renovation of our MK@Elias Park is near completion and we will be ready for operations from 2 Jan 2025 to welcome our very first cohort of K1 children. Our MK K1 programme runs from 8am to 12.30pm where children will be engaged in enjoyable and meaningful activities that promote their holistic development. We offer the 3 official Mother Tongue Languages (Chinese, Malay and Tamil) and nurture bilingualism to develop listening, speaking and early reading and writing skills through interactive games and activities. In addition to the MK programme, MK@Elias Park offers Kindergarten Care (KCare), for parents who require a full-day care service within the same premises.
