A IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENTS

1 First Day Matters (Term 3, 2022)

All students will report back to school on Monday 27 June 2022. With home and school partnership, students will learn to adjust back to school routines. Form Teachers will share school values, behavior expectations, and setting of goals for the new Semester. Students should return their Report Books to Form Teachers.

Practicing self-management skills, students are encouraged to make good use of the student planner to record their homework, assessment dates and instructions from teachers. Teachers will also communicate with parents/guardians on matters related to your child/ward by writing messages in the planner. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to spend time to go through the Student Planner to understand the academic requirements, values and standards the school expects all students to uphold as upright, responsible and respectful Eliasians.

2 Safety Management Measures

SMMs have been adjusted to follow the national posture, including guidelines from SportSG and National Arts Council, as follows:

- No group size and safe distancing requirements for school activities, including recess;
- Mask-wearing will be required indoors as a default in schools. Unmasking indoors is only allowed for Physical Education, sports, singing, wind instrument playing, speech & drama, dancing and specific groups of students in language/literacy lessons;
- Regardless of vaccination status, students will be able to participate in activities, including Co-Curricular Activities, National School Games (NSG) and Singapore Youth Festival (SYF) Arts Presentation;
- For NSG competitions, competing schools can send their student supporters to watch the semi-finals and finals at the venue, subject to the hosting venue capacity, and this would be extended at a later stage to family members and other spectators. Select competitions are also live streamed at https://go.gov.sg/nsg2022.
- Residential camps for the MOE-Outward Bound Singapore (OBS) Challenge Programme and Outdoor Adventure Learning (OAL) cohort camps will progressively resume from around end-May;
- TraceTogether-only SafeEntry check-ins in schools are no longer required. Nevertheless, students / staff are strongly encouraged to keep the TraceTogether (TT) application on their phones and/or hold on to their TT tokens, so that schools can step up contact tracing should this be needed.

Other SMMs such as schools' daily general screening of students' well-being and frequent cleaning of high-touch surfaces, will continue to be in place.

4 Safety and Traffic Reminders

Safety and physical development information may be found in the student planner. Parents are encouraged to reinforce the key points with your child/ward such as road safety and safe bus rides.

To ensure orderly dismissal, we appeal to parents/ guardians/ care-givers not to obstruct student movement, and to practice distancing when waiting outside all the school gates. We would also appreciate if you could train your child/ward to look out for the right person to accompany him/her home and not to follow strangers or their friends. If your child is unable to find his/her care-giver during dismissal, he/she should go the General Office for assistance.

(a) Drop Off / Pick Up outside School

We would like to appeal to all parents who drive their children to school to use the designated covered points located near Blocks 517 and 504, Pasir Ris Street 52, during peak traffic periods. This will alleviate the traffic congestion at Gate 1 – main entrance to school carpark. These are sheltered areas even during wet weather days.

To ensure smooth traffic along Street 52 outside Gate 2, we hope that parents can refrain from parking near the bus stop in front of Blk 519. For safety reasons and to properly educate your child/ward, please do not alight your child opposite the front of school and jaywalk across the road to get to school.

(b) Drop Off / Pick Up at the School Porch

During morning arrivals, parents are reminded to have your child seated on the left of the vehicle as this facilitates safe alighting from the vehicle. Please ensure your child is ready with his/her belongings and is able to alight quickly. For dismissal, parents will only be able to enter the school porch after all school buses depart at 1.45 p.m.

(c) Walk into School from Gate 2 (Security Post)

Students are advised to follow the designated safety route and make their road crossing where there are duty Road Marshalls to guide them. We seek your cooperation in adhering to the above traffic management guidelines for the safety of all students and staff.

1 SwimSafer[™] 2.0 Programme
